I would first like to urge the entire Senior class to keep in touch. Your experiences in the next couple of years are crucial to your life and could prove very useful to those of us preparing to


As we bring another semester to a close, we find our free to call or write at any time with your comment and/or information. The Tower is for everyone associated with Beaver College and that includes Alumni.


